Preliminary results of alcohol's harm to others in Lao PDR

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I. Introduction

- There is growing recognition that alcohol consumption has significant negative effects not only on drinkers but also on people around the drinker
- There is an increasing awareness of a significant impact of harmful use of alcohol on global health.
- The harm to others from drinking can be of many types and varying severity, and is to person or aggregates in varying relationships to the drinkers.

II. Objectives

• To estimate the prevalence of various forms of harm to others in the population at large

• To describe the harmful affects they experienced by other's drinking.

III. Methods

- Study design: Cross Sectional Study
- Sample size 1260, aged 15-64 years (response rate 99.8%) in six districts of VientianeCapital,Luangprabangand Champasak using a face-to-face
- Data collection: October 2012
- Using Stata 11.0 for data analysis

Results

Characteristics of the surveyed population:

- A total 1257 HHs in 30 villages in six districts of three provinces (one province in each part)
- Male 49.7%, female 50.3%
- Urban 68.7%, rural 31.3%
- Marital status: 75.8% married/living together
- Illiteracy 3.1%
- Farmers/fishers 23.3%

Overall effect HTO :

- 85.8% did not received any effect from other people's drinking
 - 9.4 percent most negative effect
 - 4.6 percent of them received the positive effect from other people's drinking.

Specific negative effects


- n=3,524,735
- Called name or otherwise insulted them 14%
- Pushed or shoved 5.6 %
- Ruined clothes or other belonging1 .6%
- Responsible for a traffic accident(2.0%)
- Their house, cars or property damaged 2.2%
- Had stop of work/ school.7%

Discussion (1)

• low percentage of negative affect in the Lao PDR but individual is high

• Household members, relatives and friends all make their contribution to these negative effects and especially younger are affected more often than older adults

Discussion (2)

 Work-places, homes and friendships were all commonly affected because of the drinking of others.

Recommendations

- Regular community education on the adverse effects of alcohol at the individual, household and community level
- Lao PDR should have an alcohol policy for reducing the harm from other drinking
